

Focusing through a close-up on a migrant’s phone diverts attention away from the broader context.

A mobile phone is not a symbol of comfort or privilege, but an essential communication tool, often the only link to family members left behind in the country of origin.


This type of framing also obscures a basic reality: the desire for social belonging is inherent to all people, migrants and non-migrants alike. Migrants, like anyone else, seek dignity, recognition, and inclusion, aspirations that are in no way incompatible with their legal or administrative status.


